Introduction

PE & Sport Premium Funding for schools is allocated for each financial year but the information that we publish online refers to academic years because this is how we believe parents best understand the school system.

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that you should use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years According to the DfE, there are 5 key indicators which schools should expect to demonstrate improvements across.

Primary schools are required to publish how many pupils within their Year 6 cohort are meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. This condition has been added in response to recommendations from the Swim Group, who reviewed curriculum swimming and water safety in primary schools.

The following data was collected from Year 6 children by questionnaire.

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	84%
