What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided funding of £150 million per annum since 2013 to 'provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Sports Premium is focused on improving the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision for all pupils. The proposal includes recommendations to further develop teacher training and continual professional development to make a sustained impact on the quality of physical education. A priority must be to develop the teaching skills of non-specialist teachers to create dynamic and enjoyable experiences for children.

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; swimming is expanded in order to provide a comprehensive and high-quality service for more pupils.

The information below shows how we are spending the sports funding.

At Chesterton, we have split up the funding into two key areas for consideration; Physical Education and Healthy Active Lifestyles. We have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant on the following:

Physical Education

As a school we take great pride in the achievements we make during PE lessons and beyond the school day. Many of our children 'love' to express their talents and skills during PE and are always striving to achieve further.

Our Curriculum

Throughout the school academic year, all pupils will follow a broad Physical Education Curriculum and will cover a range of different sports and activities. Our curriculum helps to build pupils confidence, teamwork and communication skills: 'achieving whilst having fun.'
At Chesterton we find having such a broad curriculum brings out many talents in individuals that they never thought they had.

Collective Vision Trust

Chesterton Primary are part of a multi-academy trust who strongly support the staff, pupils and parents they provide for. The trust also offers a strong support when it comes to Physical Education. The trust currently provides for three primary schools and a high school. As PE leads, we personally believe that 'sharing is caring' - we support each other to ensure quality physical education is being taught in every lesson. The trust also provides extra space for PE lessons and also supports Chesterton and the other schools with equipment. Chesterton and many other schools purchase swimming from the local high school.

PE Staff

At Chesterton we have a fixed PE lead who is passionate about providing a quality service to each and every pupil, helping to bring out many talents. Our PE lead also takes every PE lesson from year 1-6 and is enthusiastic in achieving pupils through their time at Chesterton. As a school we ensure each pupil is receiving the minimum of 2 hours of Physical education each week. Every lesson is currently supported by a Teaching assistant.

Future Plans

We continually evaluate the impact of how we have used our Sport Premium allocation. If the impact is positive, we continue to use the money to improve the quality of provision. We will plan to get back to competitive sports and the School Games when times are more normal and this will form part of our future spending
