Dear Parent and Families,

It has been lovely to see your children return to school, after a summer holiday of good weather, and they have all been a credit to you - thank you for sending your child in looking smart and ready to learn. The children have settled well and are already impressing us. My assembly on Tuesday was about a new start and the opportunities that are ahead if you try your best each and every day.

We are now into the second full year of our crucial knowledge curriculum and we can see and hear the difference it is making. Your children are sharing their knowledge and understanding with each other and the adults in school. The curriculum is planned to give the children a wide base of knowledge alongside strong literacy and maths.

From the  $19^{th}$  September, we are unable to hold off an increase to the price of a school dinner. Due to the rising cost of supplies and pressure resulting from the current cost of living crisis, all the Trust schools will be on the set price of £2.57. This is set by the catering company who we are contracted out to – we do not profit from this

Over the summer, we have upgraded our CCTV outside and inside the building to ensure children are safe and the property is well protected.

Maths Whizz has had some changes and the children will be re-assessed this week. There is a parent zoom session that you will be invited to on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September 6.30-7.30pm. This will be from the comfort of your home and a link will be sent out for you to click on. Further information will follow from Mr Hanson, who is our maths lead in school.



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Clubs will start week beginning 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022. Further information will follow later in the week. In addition, on the 19<sup>th</sup> September we are having a drop-in session 3-4.15pm for you to call into the classroom and meet the teacher: this is a chance to chat and find out how your child has settled in. If you can't make it then feel free to contact your child's class teacher to arrange a different time.

Class dojo is a good system to promote positive behaviours in the classroom and to strengthen lines of communication between school and home.

Each class has avatars and a different avatar is assigned to each of your children.

The teacher awards points known as "dojos" in 'my classroom', for positive or negative behaviour. You only you see your child's information

Class Dojo has 'positive' class values that teachers choose from and this will vary from class to class depending on the age and stage. Staff are busy teaching and will put dojos on at different times so don't panic if you don't see them straight away.

Dojo messaging is the easiest way of connecting with your class teacher. Please use this for communicating directly but try to keep in with working hours up until 4pm. If you have an issue that is worrying you, speak to the staff on the driveway who can help to resolve this or arrange a meeting via the office as face-to-face is always best.

Children receive an amber warning in class if they are not following the behaviour policy. This is for the teacher who will be following the behaviour system and it gives your child the opportunity to put their behaviour right and to move back to green. You do not get notified of amber as everyone deserves a chance to put things right!



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A red means parents are notified and this will be explained on a message or a phone call depending on the severity of the issue.

Examples of positive dojos – this varies from class to class and ages and stages.
