Crucial Knowledge

- A settlement is a place where people come together to live.
- Some places have more people living in them depending on what is in that place.
- Migration is when animals (including humans) move from living in one place to live in another.
- Birds migrate for different climates (temperatures).
- Humans migrate for many reasons such as: work, lifestyle, war, natural disasters.
- Population is the number of people who live together in one place.
- When people leave their country looking for refuge (protection) in another country they are called refugees.
- Equality is when everyone is being equal in all things.
