- The **Lake District** is a rural area.
- Rural means an area with lots of open fields and countryside and very few people living there.
- The Lake District is one of the wettest places in the UK.
- Scafell Pike is the highest mountain in England – and it's in the Lake District.
- There are lots of lakes and mountains in the Lake District.
- **Birmingham** is a large, urban city in England. It is the second largest city in the UK (after London).
- Urban means an area where lots of people live with lots of buildings.
- Lots of people from different cultures live in Birmingham.
