Crucial Knowledge

- The Tudor era was about 450 years ago.
- A monarch is a king or queen.
- The Tudor monarchs were: Henry VII, Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary I, and Elizabeth I.
- Henry VIII was famous for having six wives, creating the Church of England and the Royal Navy.
- Queen Elizabeth I was the daughter of Henry VIII and the last Tudor monarch.
- William Shakespeare was a famous British writer (from Stratford-upon-Avon). His work is still used today for reading and acting in plays and films. He created new words and sayings which are still used today.
- Sir Francis Drake travelled the world on a ship. He captured slaves from Africa.
- The Spanish Armada was a fleet (group) of Spanish ships sent to invade England (led by King Phillip II of Spain, the husband of Queen Mary I who had died by this time).
